

THE VICTORIAN GENE TECHNOLOGY ACCESS CENTRE



The Victorian Gene Technology Access Centre is Australia's first purpose designed gene science research and study facility, where scientists and VCE students throughout Victoria will work together.

Facilities include a cytospace theatre, teaching laboratories, interactive classroom, conference facilities and gallery spaces.

GTAC is a collaboration between the Victorian Government, (Department of Education, Department of Infrastructure and University High School); the Department of Microbiology and Immunology (University of Melbourne) and the Walter and Eliza Institute Hall of Medical Research.

The facility is an elevated, multi-levelled structure, designed to maximise student areas around the building as well as utilise the structural supports of the existing three level car park below University High School's oval, Parkville, Melbourne.
